



I am a Poem Generator

4-5 Grade Level

OBJECTIVES	This generator will help the kids understand how poetry works and they will get the satisfaction of being able to make their own poem.
MATERIALS	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Print outs of the generator, enough for each child2. Scrap paper for them to be able to brainstorm some different options for the generator questions3. Make sure every student has a writing utensil
PROCEDURES	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Give everybody a copy of the generator2. Read the questions out loud and explain them to the kids3. Brainstorm with the kids on what some of the options could be for the questions and write them on the board
ANALYSIS	To make the student understand how poetry can work and make them understand that they don't have to be super creative or talented to be able to make a poem. Also it helps to think about words and how they rhyme or go together if they choose to have their poem rhyme.
